Hain Honors Hothead Hagler; Speeches Spark Spectacle

Kenneth Hain, YCSC president, has announced that a special convocation honoring Isaac Hagler will be held on *Taanit Esther*, March 3, 1969, two days before Mr. Hain's academic record is scheduled to be reviewed by the Office of the

Registrar. Hain, who sponsored a convocation for Stan Schneider two days before he took his senior swimming test and who bought an "I Love Israel" button two days before registration, calls Isaac Hag-

ler his biggest convocnee yet. "I expect a big crowd to honor a big man in this real big event," he grinned.

Next In Line

Mr. Hagler, who came to Yeshiva several years ago and who graduated with dubious honors in 1968, is now assistant to the registrar in charge of registration. Due to his limited education, speculation is rampant that he is next in line for the job of Registrar, bypassing the more erudite Rabbi Edelstein and P. Friedenberg, who is suspect at Yeshiva for his reportedly pro-Israel leanings.

The convocation will begin promptly at 3:00 A.M. with a rendition of the "Dance of the Sugar Plum Fairies," by the secretaries of the Office of the Registrar. Following this, Messrs. Hagler and Hain will prance in. At 3:10, Mr. Hain will deliver a candid, forthright speech praising Mr. Hagler for what he has done, yet, reminding him of his gross shortcomings.

Belkin Announces Vegas Move; Hughes Takes YU As Tax Loss

Following the reading of an anti-Semitic poem on WYUR, Dr. Belkin has decided that it is time for Yeshiva to move out of the vile environs of New York City and seek a more conducive atmosphere for the pursuit of synthesis. Consequently, in a press conference on February 29, the President announced that Yeshiva will leave its Washington Heights home and move to Las Vegas.

The shift to the Nevada community was arranged in secret negotiations between Howard Hughes, the noted billionaire, and YU money man, Sheldon Shekel. Mr. Hughes, who purchased Las Vegas last year from the Seminole Indians, has been seeking in his words "to class up the joint." As a result he began to look for a school of higher education to move to his town, and after conferring with Mr. Shekel he stated: "This here's a man after my own heart — greedy; I can see my affiliation with Yeshiva University is going to be very profitable."

Pleasure Dome

Under the terms of the agreement, Mr. Hughes will turn over to Yeshiva a 613 acre parcel of land right outside Las Vegas in the Mohave Desert. It will be re-

named "Yequi Flats." In addition, since Mr. Shekel said that he couldn't imagine Yeshiva located on one campus, Mr. Hughes is giving Yeshiva one of his properties, the Hotel Pleasure Dome, to be used as in-town center. The hotel will be converted into a dormitory and classroom building. Mr. Hughes had intended to re-

move the slot machines from the hotel, but Sheldon Shekel wouldn't hear of it. "We can put them in the dorm rooms," he explained, "that way we won't have to raise tuition." When the gambling devices are removed from the hotel's casino, the large room will be converted into a *Bet Midrash*.

When Yeshiva moves to Nevada, Stern College will come uptown and occupy the old YC campus. When Stern's Dean, Professor David Mirsky was asked if his students weren't afraid of the conditions in the Washington Heights neighborhood, he replied, "Our girls like to live dangerously. Besides, who would want to attack a Stern girl?" *Observer* editor Fayge Butter was thrilled over the proposed switch. "We've always wanted a real campus," she squealed, "and compared to Stern even this place looks like a campus. We're already buying blue and yellow gravel so we can make a park out of Danciger Campus. And also, what Stern girl isn't anxious to see what a Yeshiva dorm room looks like?"

Where's Skokie?

The reaction at Yeshiva wasn't so positive. "I'm very upset," stated Rabbi Joseph Soloveitchik. "It's bad enough shlopping here from Boston. But Las Vegas! Isn't that near Skokie?" The Rav's sentiments were echoed by other faculty members, since every teacher at Yeshiva is required to hold another job in order to keep off welfare, but Dr. Belkin was unperturbed by the unrest. "Since all my actions are guided by the philosophy I expressed in my book, *In His Image*," Dr. Belkin explained, "anyone who criticizes me is committing a *chilul hashem*, and that's a no no."

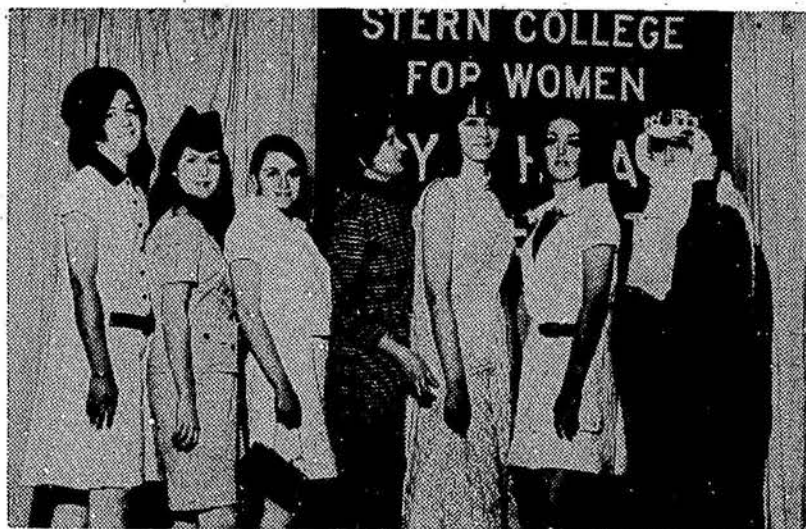

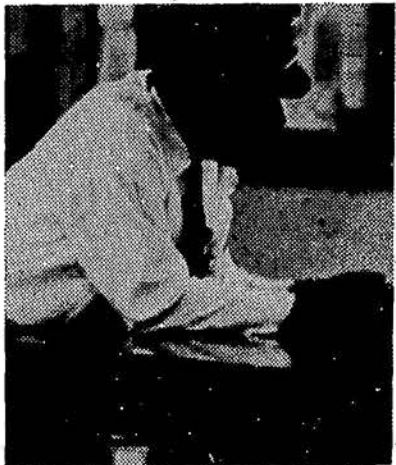

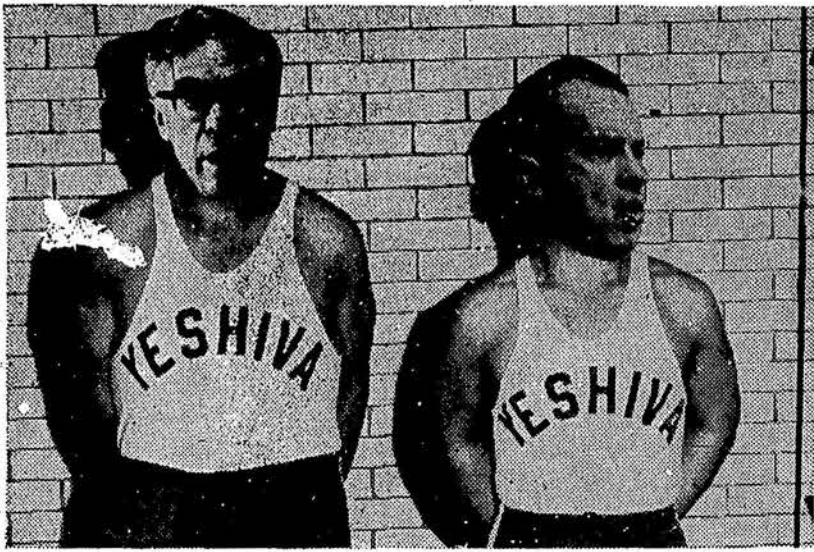

Dumber Joins Nixon Staff As Advisor For Minorities

President Richard M. Nixon in a surprise press conference announced today that Dr. Joseph Dumber will accept a position in his administration as special consultant on minority affairs. Dr. Dumber, outspoken critic of Franklin Delano Roosevelt, Harry S. Truman, Dwight D. Eisenhower, John F. Kennedy, Lyndon B. 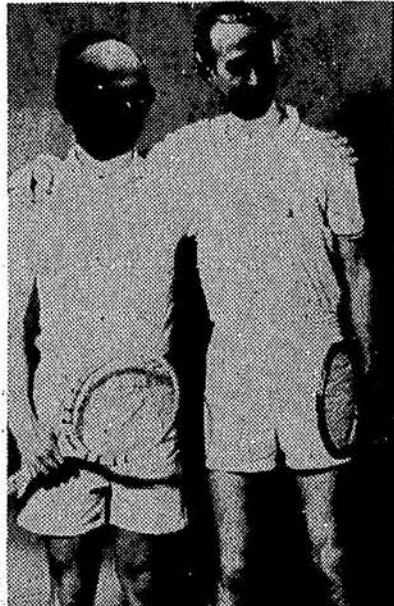
