Truth Out Of The Bag: Dr. Belkin Not For Real

The advance release of the Clifford Irving "autobiography" of Howard Hughes is expected to disclose the most startling data yet about billionaire recluse

Cigar Chomping

Also implicated in the Irving disclosure are several prominent university officials. H. R. Socol, the recipient of a \$250,000 advance from McGraw-Furst for the Yeshiva gym, allegedly deposited the money in a Swiss branch of the Dime Savings Bank of Brooklyn under the alias of H. R. Huge. New York police report the deposit was made by a woman of Socol's build wearing a blond wig and sunglasses. Police suspicions were aroused when witnesses also described the suspect's habit of cigar chomping.

Another Yeshiva official, Registrar Morose Simpleton, claimed that Irving's disclosures were really "gross attempts by someone to discredit something or other." Mister Simpleton also added that "the information was in direct contradiction to the description of the Yeshiva president as described in the 1947 catalog, Chapter 6, page 53, item 3a."

Hughes, himself, was unavailable for comment, but speaking to reporters gathered in the Greasy Spoon, a top aide stated, "While Dr. Belkin's ploys may be foiled in New York and Las Vegas, he can still secretly fly to Peking."

Informed sources close to the university have not denied the claim. In answer to a barrage of press questions, Yeshiva spokesman Sam Ars-stein stated, "For a long time everyone has known that Dr. Belkin was not for real; but we in the Office of Public Relations never thought that the truth could escape from here. Anyway, the information has been on file with the State Board of Education for over a year. Other than that, no comment."

Other university spokesmen were slow; they were also slow to comment. Assistant to the President Dizzy Miller gasped at the news and exclaimed, "Well no one ever tells me anything anyway. Besides I've been too busy catching planes."

PR Pamphlet Provides Perverse Presentation

In an attempt to encourage potential freshmen to attend Yeshiva and Stern Colleges, the office of admissions recently published a pamphlet entitled "Why YU." In it is found the answer to that question as gathered from a typical group of students from the two undergraduate schools. This representative sample included such average students as Dov Bungler, YCSC President, Martin Chynyuk, YC senator, Chaim Synthesis, another senator, Lenny Schnitzel, a junior class officer, and David Munchy, a senior from Japan. A similar group from Stern included Judi Finegirl, Esti Goldtooth, Phyllis Gorgeous, and Sarah Twinkletoes.

After speaking with these students, THE COMMENTATOR has learned that the statements printed in the pamphlet are incomplete and are actually edited versions of true taped interviews. Through a secret source in the university administration, whose name we cannot disclose, the paper is now in possession of a complete, unexpurgated copy of the original tape. As a service to our readers and because Yeshiva students have a right to know, we are now publishing the full version of the "PR TAPES." The formerly deleted remarks now appear in italics.

The interview started off with an innocent question about the attributes of attending Yeshiva.

 able situations which exist, in hopes that
 this criticism will serve as incentive for
 the Head Waiter to improve the following
 conditions:

1. Why is it necessary that students
 wait so long after services until being al-
 lowed into the cafeteria? It would seem
 that an efficient kitchen staff could have
 everything prepared beforehand. Does the
 sadistic Head Waiter enjoy locking people
 out while he piddles rearranging the mar-
 ble cake? THE COMMENTATOR calls for
 an "Open Door Policy" after services!

2. The FBI may be guilty of bugging
 the telephones, but nowhere near the pro-
 portion to which Parker is bugging the
 soup! Is it any wonder students are be-
 ginning to refer to the soup as "bug
 juice"? Doesn't the Head Waiter recognize
 the health code here? What are bugs do-

 stroke")

3. There is not much more to say for
 the meat. Students have a choice of chicken-
 tops or bottoms, hot meat, cold roast beef,

 tableside? It is hard enough facing what
 is left on your own plate, let alone what
 others chose not to finish. Must bus boys
 parade down the aisles? It is also confus-
 ing to students who mistake the bus cart
 for the waiter's tray, and begin distribu-
 ting the contents,

6. Can't the bimmies be directed to do
 their work more efficiently? Their service
 is so slow that when they went on strike
 earlier this year, they were the only ones
 who could tell!

7. The making of announcements be-
 fore benching has gotten totally out of
 hand. Must students be subjected to hear-
 ing Motzai Shabbat time barked in Army
 fashion? Can't boys escape the Army trad-
 ition? Is this not why they are at Yeshiva
 in the first place?

Answer —

- .5% "Great!!" (Student is currently being treated at Columbia Presbyterian for malnutrition.)

The facts are clear. The Head Waiter is to blame. Is it any wonder that in Yeshiva circles we hear fewer and fewer cries of, "More Parker's sausages Mom . . . please?"
