As part of YU's commitment to support the emotional health of its community, May showcased a range of programs.

**Dr. Rona Novick**, dean of Azrieli, gave the keynote address at the 3rd Annual Community Mental Health Shabbat (May 6 – 9, 2021) to communities across North America. On Thursday and Sunday, Dr. Novick led resilience workshops for high school students.

In preparation for the Mental Health Shabbat, RIETS, in partnership with the OU and RCA, held a conference call with rabbis to

share ideas and practices related to emotional wellness. Speakers included Dr. David Pelcovitz (Azrieli) and Rabbi Yaakov Neuburger (RIETS).
