Emerging Stronger Than Ever: Thousands Join YU's Commencement Live and Online

On Wednesday, May 26, more than 650 graduates and their families and friends along with YU faculty, staff and administration gathered at the Arthur Ashe Stadium at the USTA Billie Jean King National Tennis Center in Flushing Meadows-Corona Park in Queens for YU's 90th Annual Commencement Exercises.



Internationally renowned singer **Shulem Lemmer** set the tone for the event's theme of emerging stronger and more determined by singing the American and Israeli national anthems and inspiring the audience with his version of "Rise Up" by Andra Day.

"Character is shaped by adversity," said Rabbi Dr. Ari Berman, President of Yeshiva University, in his remarks. "While none of us had the map that told us how this year would unfold, we did have the compass. Our values are our compass. Even during times of deep uncertainty, they give us confidence that we are moving in the right direction."



Jason Greenblatt '85YUHS, '89YC was the commencement speaker and honorary degree recipient. The former White House Middle East Envoy was introduced by Ron Dermer, the former Israeli Ambassador to the United States, and Yousef Al Otaiba, the United Arab Emirates Ambassador to the United States.

In his keynote address, Greenblatt exhorted the graduates to "continue to build your communities and help the United States of America, the Jewish State of Israel and indeed all of humanity in meaningful ways while living up to and being true to the values of the Torah." READ MORE

For **Jonah Goldstein**, a member of a multigenerational YU family, this year's commencement was a dream come true. A graduate of the Makor College Experience, a three-year program for those with intellectual disabilities, Goldstein is the first Makor student to participate in an in-person graduation. Although he could have completed Makor in 2020, he chose to stay an additional year for this milestone event. "Jonah isn't our first graduate, but due to COVID-19, he is our first to walk at commencement with his peers," said **Dr. Stephen Glicksman**, founder of the program. Jonah exemplifies the goal of Makor to give people with disabilities the same experiences their friends and family have.



Student-Athlete Earns Historic Honor

Gabriel Leifer has been selected CoSIDA First Team Academic All-American for men's basketball in Division III, the first in YU history. Leifer, also a two-time All-American, has led the Maccabees to a pair of conference championships in his career and two trips to the NCAA Tournament. The Maccabees are currently riding the nation's longest winning streak in all divisions at 36 games. "Gabe's leadership on and off the court is a major reason our program has experienced the success it has," Yeshiva University Head Coach Elliot Steinmetz said. "That he does it in the classroom as well is a testament to his willingness to be a complete example of leadership for his teammates."
