oration filled with reflection and hope. A packed audience at Lamport Auditorium listened intently as Stephanie Butnick from *Tablet* interviewed Emil Fish, founder

of the Emil A. and Jenny Fish Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies, who shared his inspiring story of survival. #### YU Makes History in Dubai

On May 3, YU launched an historic conference at the Crossroads of Civilizations Museum in Dubai, which generated significant positive media attention. Presented in partnership with the Bernard Revel Graduate School, Rabbi Arthur Schneier Program for International Affairs and the Straus Center, the symposium, titled "Interacting Philosophies, Shared Friendships," strengthened ties between YU and the UAE and fostered dialogue between Jews and Muslims in the Middle East. The connection began in April 2021 when President Berman gave a keynote address at the Museum's Holocaust commemoration, the first of its kind in an Arab country. READ MORE

#### **Maimonides Comes to the YU Museum**

Yeshiva University Museum's exhibition, "The Golden Path: Maimonides Across Eight Centuries," opened on May 9 and showcases the life and influence of the great Jewish scholar. The exhibition includes an unprecedented array of Maimonides' manuscripts and documents, some written in his own hand and some never before seen by the public. The most impressive collection of Maimonides

artifacts ever to be displayed together, "The Golden Path" runs through December 31 at the YU Museum, located at the Center for Jewish History at 15 West 16th Street, and is free and open to the public Sundays through Thursdays. READ MORE

The first-place winning project was the SEC Filing Analyzer, an application that automates anomaly detection in companies' financial information from their SEC quarterly filings. The app fetches and analyzes data from the SEC EDGAR database, comparing new filings to previous data to find unusual movements in crucial financial metrics. #### UNDERGRADUATE COMMENCEMENT

YU's 92nd Annual Commencement Ceremony will be held on Tuesday, May 23, at 2 p.m. at the legendary Theater at Madison Square Garden in New York City.

The program will honor Jewish identity by commemorating the Holocaust and Israel's 75th anniversary.

Two individuals will be recognized for their representation of Jewish people on the world stage.

Brig.-Gen. (ret.) Dr. Daniel Gold, inventor of the revolutionary Iron Dome—the tech-

nological shield that protects Israel—will be YU's keynote speaker and receive YU's Presidential Medallion; Emil A. Fish, a Holocaust survivor and founder and benefactor of the Emil A. and Jenny Fish Center for Holocaust and Genocide Studies, will receive an honorary doctorate.
