LIBRARY ADVISORY COMMITTEE

The committee, with faculty, student, and university administration representatives, met twice and made recommendations on equipment, acquisitions, programs, and services. Professor Avraham Ravid (Sy Syms School of Business) joined the committee as representative of undergraduate faculty members, and Professor Katie Aafjes-van Doorn (Ferkauf Graduate School of Psychology) joined as representative of graduate faculty members. Yishai Mandel and Faiga Kolodny represented Student Life Committees.

POLLACK LIBRARY

- Wendy Kosakoff, Public Services and Outreach Librarian, was embedded in Wurzweiler School of Social Work's Proposal Seminars I and II for Ph.D. candidates.
- Assessment initiatives grew with introduction of a QR-code feedback form following research instruction sessions for students on the Wilf and Beren Campuses.
- Sy Syms School of Business's new writing class, Business Composition, partnered with librarian for information literacy instruction on Wilf and Beren Campuses for all sections.

- Three surveys gauged the user experience of students on textbook access, library future vision, and new initiatives.
- The Student Library Research Award went to Bluma Gross, SCW '24, a Political Science major, for "Historical and Theoretical Analysis of Colonial Healthcare," written for Professor Dina Shvetsov's Introduction to Comparative Politics.
- An online reservation system for group study rooms was launched.
- The top five research guides were Google Scholar, Holocaust Studies, Social Work, YU Student Library Research Award, and Library Research Jumpstart.
- Librarians adopted standards and best practices, with a focus on accessibility, for research guides.
- New guides included Business Research, Cybersecurity Research, and Datasets for Computer Science Capstone Projects.

COLLECTION MANAGEMENT

In collaboration of Metadata Services and Processing, a comprehensive inventory ensured accuracy of catalog records in relation to the physical collection. The project embraced collection management principles by

COVID-19 AND THE ORTHODOX JEWISH COMMUNITY PROJECT

processes. An initial portion of the collection is now available for onsite access by patrons. Remaining tasks include working on unprocessed materials, managing over 100 websites harvested, and re-engineering the collection's master list to enable robust searching and sorting.


