YCDS HISTORY

The Yeshiva College Dramatics Society as we know it today, opened its 1965 season with "Twelve Angry Men" under the expert direction of its then new advisor, Dr. Anthony S. Beukas. Since then, each of the Society's productions have been open to the public, and each has been viewed by thousands of people.

YCDS's status as one of the most respected and popular activities on campus is a result of a 40-year evolution of dramatics in Yeshiva University from a club to a society, and finally a two-credit course in the undergraduate curriculum of Yeshiva College. This success is the direct result of the outstanding talent, enthusiasm, and enduring effort of Dr. Beukas, the Society's founding director and mentor. In addition, with the encouragement of the late Dr. Abraham Tauber, former chairman of the Yeshiva College Speech Department, a Speech and Drama major was instituted in Yeshiva College. This major currently includes such course offerings as Theater Arts, Art of the Actor, Techniques of the Director, and Theater Workshop.

The 1980's were years of great physical growth for the Society. With the assistance of the Yeshiva University Women's Organization, professional stage lighting was purchased. Mr. Jay Blazer, the previous Director of YU Facilities Management, was instrumental in the acquisition of permanent theater seating. The Society's 20th season was enhanced by the addition of a lighting control board, thanks to the generosity of the Socol family. The Society's 25th anniversary season was celebrated with the opening of their new home in the Schottenstein Theater.

In 1997, the Schottenstein Theater was renovated. A new sound system was installed due to efforts of the Governing Board of YCDS. YCDS has entered the 21st century with this state of the art technology.

This semester's production of "Mister Roberts," the 15th production directed by Lin Snider, current YCDS Faculty Advisor, promises to maintain the tradition set by Dr. Beukas and the society, making each show better than the one before.

The Yeshiva College Dramatics Society marks the close of every season with a warm and festive Awards Night buffet. All YCDS members and friends are invited to this eventful evening where tribute is paid to the outstanding devotees of recent productions. Awards are presented to the best lead, supporting, and "gypsy" actors and to outstanding "techies". New members of the Chi Pi chapter of the Alpha Psi Omega Honor Society are inducted and the incoming governing board members are inaugurated.

ALPHA PSI OMEGA

Alpha Psi Omega was founded in 1925 as a national honorary dramatics fraternity to recognize and reward all aspects of student participation in university and college drama productions. There are over five hundred campus chapters across the country with membership totaling over 50,000 members.

The Chi Pi-Yeshiva Chapter of Alpha Psi Omega was granted its charter in May of 1973. Twenty-two charter members were inducted on May 7, 1973, at a formal ceremony held at Yeshiva College. Since then induction ceremonies have been held annually with the Chi Pi membership reaching over 500 members to date.

To be considered eligible for induction into Alpha Psi Omega, a student must show dedication to drama and must earn a minimum of fifty points, awarded for participation in various aspects of Dramatics Society work, including production, technical assistance, and acting.

LIN SNIDER is thrilled to be returning to YCDS to direct her fifteenth production. In addition to teaching and directing at Yeshiva, Lin is a professional director/singer/actress/teacher who has performed in cabaret, TV, film and primarily on stage in regional theaters, Off-Broadway and in the National Tour of ANYTHING GOES with Mitzi Gaynor. She has also worked at, among others, the American Academy of Dramatic Arts, NYU, SUNY Purchase, TADA!, Manhattanville College, the Horace Mann School and Concordia College as a director, musical director and teacher of voice, acting and musical theater. She serves

on the Board of two theater companies, the Out of the Box Theatre Company and Westchester Collaborative Theater, often directing for each. She holds an MSW from Columbia University and an MFA in Theater from Brooklyn College. (AEA, SDC)

DIRECTOR'S NOTES

Last semester I purposely broke the YCDS tradition of never repeating a play to bring back YCDS's first show, 12 ANGRY MEN, to celebrate our centennial show. Though I thought I had returned to the old tradition this semester with a never-before-produced play, I soon realized I was wrong – MR. ROBERTS was produced by YCDS about 12 years ago. So if I have inadvertently continued a new tradition of presenting revivals, I couldn't be happier with the show with which to do that.

Working on MR. ROBERTS has been a wonderful experience on many levels. First, it enabled me to connect with my father (though he is deceased) in a new way through letters of his I was given on my last trip to my hometown of St. Louis. He was in the Pacific in the U.S. Navy during World War II on a ship similar to the U.S.S. Reluctant and his letters home gave me and the cast (I gave them copies of the letters) a new understanding of the realities of that life.

In addition, this script, through its wide range of moods, its diversity of characters, and its overall humanity, I feel teaches us all about what is truly important in life: the relationships we share and the contributions, however small, we all make to the success of our world.

And lastly, I feel there are parallels between the relationships we see among the men in MR. ROBERTS and those we find in YCDS. The cast, crew and Board definitely experience struggles, frustrations and tensions but we all grow closer together as we overcome our obstacles and see all our efforts coming to fruition in a show that we are proud of and that we truly hope you enjoy.

Having said that, the show which you are about to see, as always, is the result of the tireless efforts of not only the students, but also a result of the wonderful support we receive from the University. Without the acknowledgement and cooperation of the school, YCDS would not exist and the valuable experiences provided through the performing arts would be unavailable to these young men.

And lastly, I feel I often forget to thank you, the audience, for coming to our shows and showing your appreciation for YCDS. For it is ultimately for you that we take on the process of developing a production and it is the connection that we feel with you as you watch us that makes the whole experience so fulfilling for us.

HISTORY AND CONTEXT

Mister Roberts is the story of the crew of the USS Reluctant, a navy cargo ship stationed in the safe area of the Pacific Ocean during World War II. Ships like these were very common for transporting goods to and from other ships, as well as to and from ports controlled by the Allied forces.

This play takes place during the final days of the War in Europe, as the Allied forces had borne down on Germany and demanded the unconditional surrender of the Nazi-led country. After the Germans surrendered on V-E Day (May 8th, 1945), the US continued to battle the Japanese in the Pacific until September 2, 1945.

The play is based on Thomas Heggin's 1946 novel of the same name. The novel began as a collection of short stories about Heggen's experiences aboard the USS Virgo (AKA-20) in the South Pacific during World War II. Broadway producer Leland Hayward acquired the rights for the play and hired Heggen and Joshua Logan for the adaptation.


Mister Roberts won the Tony Award for Best Play in 1948.




MISTER ROBERTS
