Jihad – Coming to a Library Near You

American libraries, once-upon-a-time, bastions of knowledge and culture, have become platforms for radical progressive agendas- like a trellis propping up a plague of poison-ivy sneaking up in your yard. Ideologies devoid of Judea-Christian morality prey on vulnerable minds. But now, a new threat lurks behind the bookshelves...

Well-orchestrated Arab propaganda has subtly - persistently - elbowed its way onto the

shelves of libraries (and bookstores), embedding advocacy for Islam, especially, empathy for a fabricated cause: “Palestinians.” Concomitantly, advancing adamant Jew-hatred and anti-Israel rhetoric. This premeditated campaign spews lies of a Jewish colonial occupation robbing indigenous people of their land. And the ALA (American Library Association) is happily on board with this Great Lie.

CAIR (Council on American-Islamic Relations) has devised a *Palestine Beyond Borders Toolkit* (2023) to “help feature book displays in libraries and bookstores.” (1)

Its website tugs at the strings of every liberal, leftist, bleeding heart - among them, so-called “humanitarian” Jews - to become partners encouraging libraries to promote “cultural diversity, understanding, and inclusivity” by showcasing the “Palestinian experience.” These are pros who know how to manipulate mass-media.

Specific titles are highlighted, and detailed strategies recommended, to promote these books to libraries and bookstores. Inversely, for store and library administrators, the website includes advice on how to design eye-catching displays and – how to deal with opposition from staff, patrons, or customers.

Here is a sample of the suggested titles:

- *The Ethnic Cleansing of Palestine* (2006). A review states that author Ilan Pappé “... offers impressive archival evidence to demonstrate that, from its very inception, a central plank in Israel’s founding ideology was the forcible removal of the indigenous population.” This statement is from a bibliography prepared for the Current World Events Discussion Series of the *American Library Association’s* Social Responsibilities Round Table. Therefore, ALA approved. (2)

Selected quotes illustrate the thrust of the book, ideas currently spewed by racist pro-Hamas protesters:

“The fact that the expellers were newcomers to the country, and part of a colonization project, relates the case of Palestine to the colonialist history of ethnic cleansing in North and South America, Africa and Australia, where white settlers routinely committed

such crimes.(p. 30)...Half of the indigenous people living in Palestine were driven out, half of their villages and towns were destroyed, and only very few among them ever managed to return.” (p. 31)

The truth? Those “indigenous” people, “Palestinians,” were predominantly *foreigners*. Pre-1948, the British encouraged an influx of illegal Arab immigrants from lands such as Morocco, Yemen, and Iraq, to placate surrounding Arab powers and force an Islamic demographic engulfment of Israel (then under the degrading misnomer of “Palestine”) to dwarf the Jewish population. Even thugs and terrorists were allowed illegal entry. (3) Arabs who *did* live in Israel considered the land to be part of Syria, certainly not an independent Arab territory with its own people and culture. In 1948, easy booty was promised to Arabs in “Southern Syria” by the Islamic nations, who guaranteed complete annihilation of the Jews by the armies flying the crescent flag. These “Palestinian” Arabs fled to avoid the bloodbath. But when the Jews miraculously survived, the salivating expectations of these Arabs were foiled; *they* became refugees... Refugee centers sprang up, created by the UN, which became a magnet for *outside* Arabs to falsely claim refugee status and gain free healthcare, food, and schooling. Result: A large percentage of present day “Palestinians” is comprised of a hodge podge from the dregs of Arab countries. Little wonder that Jordan (the section of Israel cropped and allocated by the British to the Arabs) refuses to accept them, simultaneously, weaponizing their existence against the Jewish state. No Islamic country wants them.

More on “ethnic cleansing”:...for many Zionists Palestine was not even an ‘occupied’ land when they first arrived there in 1882, but rather an ‘empty’ one: the native Palestinians who lived there were largely invisible to them or, if not, were part of nature’s hardship and as such were to be conquered and removed.” (pp.33-34)

Apparently, this was the observation of not only Zionist Jews but also many *gentile* travelers to Israel in the 18th and 19th centuries. Fred M. Gottheil’s statistical study of the population of “Palestine” during that period supports the reports of pre-20th century travelers to the Holy Land”...if there was any unanimity of opinion among Western writers of the mid-nineteenth century Palestine, it was on this issue: that the country was considerably underpopulated... With a population estimate for Palestine thus derived... it seems reasonable...to accept with some confidence the descriptions offered by mid-nineteenth century writers concerning the Palestine demographic landscape.” One eyewitness account: “There is nothing to break the solitude, save now and then a string of camels on their way between Hebron and Jerusalem. Not a house, or sign of human habitation, is visible.”(4) A Christian theologian and professor of French Literature, Felix

Bovet, observed the land in similar condition in 1858. He added that “close to half of the population of Jerusalem is Jews, and that a majority of the Jews in Jerusalem are indigenous, that is, Turkish subjects...the Turks ‘have made a desert of it where it is scarcely possible to walk without fear. Even the Arabs who dwell there do so as temporary sojourners.’” (5) Mark Twain noted the desolation of the land in 1867. There was always a Jewish population in Israel but not until the en masse Jews’ return to Zion did the land flourish once again.

• *Palestine: A Four Thousand Year History* (2018), by Nur Masalha, should have been titled: “Everything You Wanted to Know About the Name Palestine But Were Afraid to Ask.” The author cites many sources to prove that a country of *Palestine* existed, *but not Israel*, negating G-d's promise to the Biblical Patriarchs and the ancient, historical claims of their descendants to the land of Israel. “After more than 150 years and thousands of biblical excavations carried out in and around the Old City of Jerusalem, there is still no material history or archaeological or empirical evidence for the ‘Kingdom of David’ from 1000 BC. The reason for the lack of any material or empirical evidence for the ‘United Kingdom of David and Solomon’ and other mega-narratives of the Old Testament is simple: these are invented traditions.” (p.36) Apparently, Mr. Masalha hasn’t done his homework and gets an F in history. Archeological evidence is abundant, such as the Tel Dan Inscriptions (9th century BCE) , discovered in 1993, which refers to the “King of the House of David” and the “King of Israel” (6). In 2005 and 2008, Royal Seals, 2,600 years old, were unearthed, bearing the names of King Zedekiah's Ministers mentioned in the Bible. (7) The “Yehud coin,” dating approximately 350 BCE, minted in Jerusalem, clearly shows the letters YHD (Judea) in ancient Hebrew characters. (8)

The book commences with the Late Bronze Age, citing the ancient Philistines (*Plishtim* in Hebrew), attempting to mesh present-day Arabs with the extinct, barbaric, seafaring people who settled along the coast of the Levant, possibly from the Aegean area, Caphtor/Crete. (9) (The Philistines’ oppression of the Hebrew tribes is recounted in the Bible, most notably in the story of Samson in the Book of Judges.) But similar to Darwin’s missing link, the author fails to show any link between ancient Philistia and the Arabs who today demand inheritance of Israel - “Palestine.”

From where does the name Palestine originate? In 135 CE, after defeat of the Judean Bar-Kochba revolt, Roman Emperor Hadrian (117-138 CE), in his megalomaniac quest to

erase any vestige of Judaism from the land of *Judea*, renamed the land Syria Palaestina, after those Philistines, as an affront to the conquered Jews. The Holy City of Jerusalem was defiled with the pagan name Aelia Capitolina. The derogatory name “Palestine” was continuously adopted by subsequent conquerors. The author acknowledges the renaming by Hadrian *and the Judean revolt*, but states the Roman emperor’s choice of name had nothing to do with the *Biblical* Philistines - the region [Israel] was called Philistia. (p.87) In this exercise of oxymoronic (or moronic) logic, the author admits a Judean revolt occurred while simultaneously claiming that the Jews have no historical connection to the land.

Whatever “Israelite” entity that might have existed was a cacophony of various peoples and cultures. (10)

The author attempts to prop up claims of an ancient “Palestine” (not Israel) by mentioning historical maps featuring that name, but, strangely, provides no images of these important primary sources. [This oddity is noted in a *positively* slanted review of the book. (11)] “The name Palestine is the most commonly used from the Late Bronze Age (from 1300 BC) onwards.” (P.11). As “proof,” he cites Islamic maps, which, of course, continued using the offensive name given by Hadrian, *who lived centuries prior to Muhammad, founder of Islam, who was born 570 CE*. The book mentions ancient Philistine coins, as if “Palestinians” are the resurrected defunct Philistines. (It’s interesting to note that Arabic has no “p” sound. All Islamic renderings of “Palestine” are *Filastin*.)

• *These Olive Trees*, written and illustrated by Aya Ghanameh, is a children’s book, telling the story of a little girl whose family is forced to flee their beloved land and olive trees in 1967. (Notice how the motif of the Wandering Jew is adapted to the “Palestinian,” flipping the scenario, where the Jew becomes the oppressor.) The author of this tender children’s book has an impressive resume: “Aya Ghanameh has threatened violence against Zionists, justified terrorism against Israeli civilians, expressed support for violence, which called for Israel’s destruction. She denied the Jewish connection to Israel, spread anti-Semitism, honored and glorified terrorists and their leader, whitewashed terrorism and promoted hatred of Israelis and Zionists.” (12)

A key to the Nazi’s *modus operandi* was indoctrinating their youth in anti-Semitic propaganda. The Arab strategy is to inculcate a terrorist, suicide-bomber mentality into

their own children. On the internet you can find videos of Hamas “camps” *for children*, teaching techniques of murder and torture, to be targeted especially against Jews. Wearing cartridge belts and wielding guns, little ones and youths passionately scream of giving their blood to redeem “Palestine.” (13) Dor Shachar, a Gazan convert to Judaism, knows the truth that leftist Jews refuse to see: “There are no innocent civilians in Gaza... My grandfather would point at the Israeli soldiers and say, ‘You see those dogs? They took my land in Jaffa. All the land in Israel is ours. Kill them when you grow up.’ My father, upon hearing of Jews being killed, would say, ‘Thank God [Allah], let them all die.’ He worked in Israel for 27 years, alongside Jews...” (14) But for the bleeding-heart Western world, charming books seek to capture the American child with sweet stories and fairy tales encasing the Great Lie.

One can explore the *Teach Palestine* website for more “Children’s books About Palestine.” (15) The pro-Israel CAMERA Education Institute has compiled an annotated list of such “Biased Books.” (16) For example, in *A Little Piece of Ground*, by Elizabeth Laird, a 12-year-old Arab boy fears the Israeli soldiers in their tanks, depicted as “great armored machines lying down there, like a row of green scaly monsters, crouched waiting to crawl back up the hill and pin the people of Ramallah down in their houses again ...” This book was mandated reading for sixth graders in Newark, NJ, public schools but has since been removed over protest. (17) What child exposed to such stories of monstrous Israelis/Jews would not learn to fear and hate Israelis – and Jews? The story of *Little Red Riding Hood* has now morphed into a “Palestinian” child threatened by the Big Bad Wolf, the evil Israeli/Jew.

The ALA is thoroughly complicit in this jihad of the American library. As far back as 2002, it composed a “Resolution on the Destruction of Palestinian Libraries, Archives, and Other Cultural Institutions”(18), ignoring the fact that “Palestinian” schools, libraries, and museums are strategically exploited by terrorist factions as shields for rocket launchers and arsenals aimed at innocent *Israeli civilians - including children*.

The Association of Jewish Libraries (AJL) has done little, if anything, to counter this Islamic anti-Israel campaign. The schedule for the AJL’s 2024 conference listed no

presentations or lectures to discuss the growing proliferation of Islamic anti-Israel propaganda in libraries nor any plans to create its own “toolkit” to combat this hype. (19)

A sad dearth of modern books exists - especially in juvenile literature - relating the *truth*, the perpetual link between the Hebrews and their ancestral land. This leaves Islamic propaganda free to run amok.

The Israeli government is, in fact, the worst advocate for Israel. At best, offering apologetics for the State of Israel’s existence. A true “ghetto mentality.” Little wonder there are few books expressing the simple fact: There never was, or is, a “Palestine.” There are no “Palestinian” people. “As the eminent historian Philip Hitti told an Anglo-American commission of inquiry on Palestine in 1946, ‘There is no such thing as Palestine in history, absolutely not.’”(20)

According to Sha’i ben-Tekoa, scholar, author, and radio host: “Under the Turks for four centuries prior to WWI (1914-18), there had been no administrative district called ‘Palestine’ and no Arab/Muslim called himself a ‘Palestinian.’ ‘Palestinian national movement’ dates to an Arab League meeting in Cairo on March 29, 1959, when President Gamal Abdel Nasser suggested that the generic term ‘Arab refugees’ be replaced. It had been in use since 1949 because so many of them had been migrant workers from all over the Arab world working in *Eretz Yisrael* at the time of Israel’s War of Independence and there was nothing ‘Palestinian’ about them.” (21)

Ben-Tekoa is the author of *Phantom Nation: Inventing the “Palestinians” as the Obstacle to Peace*, a two volume historical work replete with primary sources attesting to the myth of a “Palestinian people,” a strategic invention of the Arab states to switch the David & Goliath scenario. No longer would the world see little Israel surrounded by hordes of hostile countries bent on its utter destruction. Now, Israel would be portrayed as an aggressive colonial power stealing “Palestine” from its native people.

In February 1919, the Muslim-Christian Association declared: "We consider Palestine part of Arab Syria, as it has never been separated from it at any time." (22) Haj Amin al-Husseini, grand mufti of Jerusalem, who met with Hitler regarding the "Jewish problem," assisted in the establishment of the regional newspaper *Southern Syria*. The *Palestine Post* (the *Jerusalem Post* of today) was a prominent *Jewish* newspaper in Israel. (23)

In a 1970 interview on Thames TV, Golda Meir emphatically stated: There were no "Palestinians," only Jews and Arabs. *She* was a Palestinian and had even carried a Palestinian passport under the British mandate. (24) On a personal note, Chaim Malaky of Passaic, NJ, a former resident of Pardes Hanna, Israel, introduced me to a building constructed in 1960 by Arab workers, predominantly from the town of *Umm al-Fahm*. He recalled how an Arab angrily retorted when referred to as "Palestinian" by a Jew: "*Ana la Falasteen! Ana Arab! Enta Falasteen!*" ["I'm not a Palestinian! I'm an Arab! *You're* a Palestinian!"] Yes, Arabs living in "Palestine" considered Israel to be part of Syria and were insulted if you called them "Palestinians."

Regarding division of the spoils after the assured glorious victory of Islam in 1948, the Arab League's Secretary-General Abdul Rahman Azzam Pasha declared: Egypt would get the Negev; Syria the Galilee; the coastal part as far as Acre would be added to Lebanon. Jordan was expected to grab "the central hill regions" (Judea/Samaria). No mention of "Palestine" being allotted to a distinct "Palestinian" nation. Because *there was no "Palestinian nation."* (25)

In 1977, Zahir Muhse'in, of the PLO Executive Committee, told the Amsterdam newspaper *Trouw*: "The Palestinian people does not exist. The creation of a Palestinian state is only a means for continuing our struggle against the state of Israel for our Arab unity...Only for political and tactical reasons do we speak...about the existence of a distinct 'Palestinian people...'" (26) As emphatic evidence to this Great Lie, Yassir Arafat stated: "The Palestinian people have no national identity. I, Yasir Arafat...will give them that identity through conflict with Israel." (27)

And the two-state solution? Following the Balfour Declaration, the pledged homeland for the Jews was dissected, 78% cropped out by the British to appease Muslim interests. Present day Jordan (formerly Transjordan – “across the Jordan” River) *was originally included in the land designated for the Jews*. But this new Arab country, created by Britain, and its surrounding Islamic neighbors, refused to absorb their co-religionist refugees after the Jews’ victory; instead, they utilized them as pawns against Israel.

At the Madrid Conference in Spain, October 30, 1991, the *Israeli government* (i.e., Prime Minister Yitzchak Shamir) acquiesced to the concept “Palestinian,” creating the political phantasm. (Ironically, while peace advocate Abe Nathan languished in an Israeli jail for communicating with Yasir Arafat.) The coup de grace to Israel followed two years later, when Prime Minister Yitzchak Rabin shook the blood-soaked hand of the murderer Arafat at the Oslo Accords in 1993, giving legitimacy to the Great Lie. Since that fateful, disastrous day, subsequent Israeli governments stubbornly cling to the Great Lie, creating suicidal quicksand for the Jewish state.

This current campaign of lies, manifested in pro-terrorist protests and jihad of public and school libraries, should be of no surprise to those acquainted with Islamic mentality. Deception and deceit is a holy tool of Islamic conquest. “According to the authoritative Arabic text *Al-Taqiyya fi Al-Islam*, ‘*Taqiyya* [deception] is of fundamental importance in Islam. Practically every Islamic sect agrees to it and practices it... *Taqiyya* is very prevalent in Islamic politics, especially in the modern era.’” (28) Muhammad, founder of Islam, advocated duplicity in war (*Sahih Bukhari* 7:67:427). To Arabs, Israel’s concessions and overtures of peace are signs of weakness - every treaty is meant to be broken, an artifice to use when the enemy is most vulnerable. *Tehilim* (Psalms, 120: 5,7) aptly states: “Woe is me...that I dwell with the tents of Kedar...I [am for] peace; but when I speak, they are for war.” Kedar was a descendent of Ishmael and, according to Islam, the ancestor of Mohammed. (29)

What can *you* do? Visit your local public or school library - or bookstore. What books do they have on “Palestine?” Are they prominently displayed? What books do they have on

Israel as a balance? Is there a blatant agenda being advanced? If you see anti-Israel bias, make your voice heard. Request equal footing for pro-Israel materials. Request the acquisition of books such as Sha'i Ben-Tekoa's *Phantom Nation: Inventing the "Palestinians" as the Obstacle to Peace* (2018) and *From Time Immemorial: The origins of the Arab-Jewish conflict over Palestine* (2002) by Joan Peters. Also. *History Upside Down: The Roots of Palestinian Fascism and the Myth of Israeli Aggression* (2007) by David Meir-Levi.

For children's books:

- *What Does Israel Mean to Us?: Explaining to Your Tweens Israel's Significance and Moral Standing* (2024) by Yisroel Juskowitz.
- *We Stand with ISRAEL: Coloring Book for Kids* (2023) by Samuel Amsalu.
- *Z is for Zionism: Introduce your child to the true inspiring history of Israel and the Jewish people* (2020) by Ze'ev Zion.
- *Keeping Israel Safe: Serving the Israel Defense Forces* (2008) by Barbara Sofer.

If you are a Jewish author, consider writing juvenile material illustrating the beauty of *Eretz Yisrael* (the Land of Israel) and its eternal historical connection to the Jewish people. Don't be surprised to find a blatant scarcity of children's books specifically about *Eretz Yisrael* in Judaica bookstores.

If you are an educator, learn the facts and *teach the facts*. Most Yeshiva students are ill-equipped to adequately defend the Biblical and historical claims of the people of Israel for the Land of Israel. Nor do they understand the Arab machinations fabricating a "Palestine." Every Jewish school should integrate this essential knowledge into its Jewish history curriculum at age-appropriate levels.

The most important lesson is this: There never was or is a "Palestine." Let us refrain from

even using the name.

If you think there is nothing you can do, there is *much* you can do.

There are many fronts to this battle and we all can fight, according to our abilities.
